The N° 8204S cabinet knob was often used in Neoclassical Park Avenue apartment buildings of the 1920s. A straight knurl complements the ogee face and torus edge of the knob, which is also available with a beaded, roped knurl or plain astragal. The shallow cove of the shank is echoed in the edge of the optional rosette, which is available at an additional cost. It is often specified with the companion N° 1204 knob, which is manufactured in a variety of sizes for full-sized doors. All Nanz plated and patinated <u>finishes</u> are available.
